

Pharmacy-based Sexual Health Service Consultation

Confidentiality

Be open and honest about confidentiality with the client
Information will only be shared if the client or someone else is at risk or in danger and if this needs to happen it will always be discussed with the client first

Safeguarding

Consider, and if necessary, manage any safeguarding issues
Ensure client is Fraser Competent

Options for Emergency Contraception

Discuss of all three options for emergency contraception with the client
Cu-IUD **ellaOne** **Levonelle**

Assessment of Suitability

Assess the client's suitability to receive EHC in line with the relevant PGD
A pregnancy test may be required to exclude pregnancy

Supply of Emergency Hormonal Contraception

Supply EHC in line with the PGD if appropriate

Advice

Provide advice on the avoidance of pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections through safer sex and condom use
Include how to use a condom
Make a supply of condoms where appropriate

Information

Provide information about long-term contraceptive methods including information about LARCs

LARCs
Contraceptive implant Intrauterine system
Contraceptive injection Intrauterine device

Others
Hormonal pill / patch / ring Sterilisation
Barrier Methods Natural Family Planning

Signposting

Provide details of where and how to access services that provide:

- long-term contraceptive methods
- sexual health advice and STI services (including screening)
- further advice and care
