How PCNs Can Engage with Community Pharmacy



- PCN Leaders / Clinical Directors should engage with community pharmacy, through the PCN CP Lead.
- Encourage all GP practices to engage with their local pharmacies (PCN pharmacist / pharmacy technician).
- Discuss and agree best method of communication / how best to engage with each other.
- Consider topics to discuss / joint projects to support the development of local relationships, e.g. Walk in my Shoes, optimising business as usual processes such as electronic Repeat Dispensing (eRD), efficient communication routes. Chose topics of mutual benefit.
- Plan how efforts on public health and wellbeing could be coordinated across pharmacy, general practice and others, e.g. common campaign topics.

Collaboration Opportunities

There are several opportunities for links, collaboration and improved patient outcomes between community pharmacy and general practice / PCNs.

• Improving prevention and health inequalities

Flu – aligned incentives (through Investment Impact Fund (IIF) and Pharmacy Quality Scheme (PQS)) to increase uptake.

- Cardiovascular disease diagnosis and prevention Directed Enhanced Services (DES) link with community pharmacy Hypertension Case Finding Service.
- Inequalities PCN, local commissioners and Local Pharmaceutical Committee (LPC) to agree an approach, link with NICE QS196 and supported by PQS.
- Healthy Living Pharmacy (HLP)
- <u>Pharmacy commissioned services</u> Emergency Contraception, Stop Smoking, Hep C.

• Improved primary care access

Community Pharmacist Consultation Service (<u>CPCS / GP CPCS</u>) – Winter Access Fund, within IIF and NHS Operational Planning Guidance 2022/23.

- Community pharmacy open and providing services outside of GP operating hours.
- Delivering better outcomes for patients on medicines

Structured Medication Reviews (SMR) – link with pharmacy services, Discharge Medicines Service (DMS), requests for Multiple Compartment Compliance Aids (MCCAs).

- Community pharmacy PQS Anticoagulant Audit.
- Antimicrobial Resistance PQS supporting this work.
- New Medicines Service (NMS) opportunity for GP practice to routinely refer patients starting a new medicine to the service, link to SMR referral from community pharmacy for patients with unresolved issues.
- Relationships improve and grow, PCN SMR DES includes role of pharmacy technician in developing a relationship with community pharmacies.

• Sustainable NHS

Reducing carbon emissions – supported by PQS inhaler return for destruction. Inhaler changes – link to NMS for patients who change device.
