Services Information

NMS Contract Changes – What You Need to Know

The contractual settlement for 2025/26 included some changes to the NMS which came into effect from 1st April 2025:

• Changes to the payment structure & fees – this has been simplified to a £14 fee for each intervention or follow up consultation provided, i.e. a total fee of £28 will be paid if both the intervention and follow up consultations are undertaken. This does not change the existing service requirement to undertake the intervention consultation and try to contact the patient to undertake the follow up consultation, but a £14 payment can only be claimed if a consultation has been undertaken. If the patient cannot be contacted by the pharmacy to undertake a consultation, the fee for that consultation cannot be claimed. - Inclusion of antidepressants (from October 2025) depression will be added to the list of eligible conditions for NMS from October and further details will be published before this date. This is a major and welcome step forward, recognising the vital role pharmacies can play in supporting patients starting treatment for mental health. Although there is no mandatory training there is a related training programme, consulting with people with mental health problems, which is included in the 2025/26 Pharmacy Quality Scheme which might be helpful to help build confidence and skills in this area (as well as helping you to meet a quality criteria).
- NMS subcontracting to be stopped there will be changes to the Service Directions to clarify that NMS may not be provided through a remote consultation by a pharmacist working off the pharmacy premises who is not employed by the pharmacy owner. Read more <u>here</u>.

Pharmacy First Final Reminder - Bundling Deadline is Nearly Here

The Pharmacy First bundling requirement comes in on 1st June 2025 (see <u>here</u> for information on advanced service bundling). The deadline for registering for the three services (Pharmacy First, Pharmacy Contraception Service and the Hypertension Case–Finding Service) on the Manage Your Service (MYS) portal is **11.59pm on Saturday 31st May 2025**. If pharmacy owners have not registered by this date/time for the three services, they will not be entitled to the June monthly payment for Pharmacy First even if they meet the minimum number of Clinical pathway consultations in June.

End of Antiviral Prescribing for 2024/25 Influenza Season

Antiviral medicines for the prophylaxis and treatment of influenza should no longer be supplied in primary care on presentation of an FP10 prescription form. See <u>here</u> for further information.

Smoking Cessation Service - Inclusion Criteria

The following information provides clarification regarding the inclusion criteria for the Pharmacy Smoking Cessation Service (SCS). As per the service specification, the inclusion criteria for this service is as follows:

• People aged 18 years and older who have started treatment for tobacco dependence in hospital and have chosen to continue their treatment in community pharmacy after discharge.

For further clarity, please note that whilst the criteria refers to starting treatment in the hospital, it does not specifically mandate that Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT) must have been initiated.

As per CPE's guidance:

Q. I have received an SCS referral from an NHS Trust, but the patient was not provided with any NRT while in hospital or on discharge. Is the patient eligible for SCS?

A. Yes. If the patient has accepted very brief advice (VBA) on smoking and has agreed to being referred to a pharmacy for SCS, then this is acceptable as 'treatment' and the patient would be eligible to receive the service.

Therefore, please be aware that Very Brief Advice (VBA) is recognised as a valid form of treatment under the service's inclusion criteria. Please see our website <u>here.</u>
