# Pharmacy Quality Scheme (PQS) 2025/26

Final Reminder - Gateway Criterion - Act by Sunday 31st August 2025

Pharmacy owners must be signed up for both the Pharmacy First and Pharmacy Contraception Service by Sunday 31st August 2025, and remain registered until 31st March 2026. See further information and support resources <a href="here">here</a>.

#### **Clinical Audit: Sore Throat Management**

Community pharmacies are reminded that the upcoming PQS Clinical Audit on sore throat management is to begin on 1st September 2025. The audit focuses on patients with a FeverPAIN score of O-3, supporting antimicrobial stewardship and appropriate use of antibiotics under the Pharmacy First Service. Pharmacies must collect data over a 4-week period (extendable to 8 weeks if needed) and submit findings via the Manage Your Service (MYS) portal by 31st March 2026. All consultations must meet five audit standards, including use of the TARGET RTI leaflet and providing AMS advice.

Reminder: Do not start audit activity before Monday 1st September 2025 — early data will not be accepted. Ensure your team is briefed and ready to record data accurately.

#### Childhood Flu Vaccination Advanced Service

**REMINDER: Register by this Sunday (31st August)** – Contractors are reminded that they must register to provide this service on the NHSBSA's MYS portal by 23:59 on Sunday 31st August if they want to receive supply of vaccine by the service start date on 1st October 2025.

Before registering for this service, contractors must read the <u>service specification</u> for the full requirements of service delivery, and consider if they are able to meet these. **This includes a requirement that staff providing the service must have an Enhanced DBS certificate, with checks against the adult and children's barred list.**

#### **NHS Flu Vaccination Service**

Permission for Off-Site Vaccinations (Adult & Childhood Flu Services) – A key change for this season includes a requirement to seek permission from the commissioner prior to undertaking vaccinations at a location off the pharmacy premises. An email, which is being sent out this week by NHSE, confirms the local arrangements for applying for consent to carry out vaccinations at a location other than the pharmacy premises. Contractors will be sent a link to an MS Form which will need to be completed for **each location**, except for housebound patients

(only one form needs to be completed for all housebound patients). Please check your pharmacy NHSmail for details. If you have any queries, please contact <a href="mailto:england.wysit@nhs.net">england.wysit@nhs.net</a>.

Reminder – Adult Flu Vaccination Start Dates – The service starts next Monday (1st September 2025) but can ONLY be provided to pregnant women. Vaccination of all other eligible cohorts cannot commence until 1st October 2025.

**Vaccines** - There is a useful vaccines poster (see <a href="here">here</a>) which has information on the different types of flu vaccines available for the 2025 to 2026 flu season and the clinical risk groups that they apply to. Pharmacy teams may want to consider printing off this poster as a helpful resource for use by members of the team involved with the flu service.

#### PharmRefer Communications – SystmOne GP Practices

The West Yorkshire ICB emailed West Yorkshire pharmacies last week on 21st August, regarding the NHSE confirmed plans to roll out the integrated referral solution for GP practices using SystmOne to make in-workflow referrals through to the Pharmacy First Service. The update notes that it is expected that all GP practices using SystmOne will have this functionality the week commencing 25th August 2025.

#### **Updated West Yorkshire Adult Asthma Guidelines**

The West Yorkshire Adult Asthma Guidelines have been updated to reflect the 2024 BTS/NICE/SIGN asthma guidelines, and these were approved at West Yorkshire APC on 31st July. There are changes to promoting single inhaler therapy (ICS/formoterol) as reliever only or Maintenance and Reliever Therapy (MART) as the preferred treatment for asthma, and stopping using salbutamol for these patients.
