Pharmacy First GP Referrals

GP practices using the TPP (SystmOne) operating system now have the option to send referrals for Pharmacy First using an in-workflow process which will send referrals directly to PharmOutcomes (or alternative pharmacy workflow platform). The new process allows the GP practice to send a referral without the need to log into another system removing the requirement for MFA. Those practices who have already implemented the system have given positive feedback about convenience and ease of use.

CPWY is working with practices across West Yorkshire to support activation of the new system, but while that roll out continues, pharmacies should continue to monitor their NHSmail for patient referrals.

Hypertension Case-Finding Service - ABPMs

If your pharmacy provides the Hypertension Case-Finding Service (HCFS), you must have an ABPM device and, where a patient's reading indicates the need for ABPM, this should be offered in a timely manner.



Nationally, the conversion rate from those people eligible for ABPM following a clinic check is considerably lower than expected and we know that patients are sometimes reluctant to have ABPM. To help pharmacy teams deliver this element of the HCFS, we have produced a short briefing which includes examples of how to have conversations about ABPM with patients. IMPORTANT REMINDER: ABPM Requirements Coming Soon (1st October 2025)

As part of "bundling" requirements to qualify for the fixed Pharmacy First monthly payment, pharmacies will be required to deliver at least one ABPM provision per month from 1st October 2025.


Tip: the best way to ensure you do at least one ABPM per month is to work with your local surgeries and encourage them to refer patients to you. That way you aren't reliant on finding someone who needs one yourself.

Pharmacy Provision of Bundled Services in West Yorkshire

The pie-chart below shows the % of pharmacies currently meeting the new threshold requirements which would allow them to access the full funding for Pharmacy First once introduced later this year (ABPM requirement from 1st October 2025, PCS requirement from March 2026).

It is fantastic to see the progress already made since February with an increase from 35% to 44% of pharmacies meeting the new threshold requirements!

Over the coming months our ambition is to support pharmacies to meet the new bundling threshold requirements and turn our CPWY pie chart green!



Joint Flu Collaboration

Changes to the Leeds Community Urgent Eyecare Service

The telephone number for the Leeds Community Urgent Eyecare Service (CUES) is now **030 333 00 280.** This new telephone line has been set up because the ICB has, regretfully, asked the service provider to cap the number of urgent eyecare appointments available through the Leeds CUES. There will still be 140 slots per week (Monday to Saturday lunchtime).

Update on Multi-Sector Rotations for Foundation Trainee Pharmacists

NHS England has extended the timeline for mandatory multi-sector rotations (minimum 13 weeks in another sector) within Foundation Trainee Pharmacist Programmes (FTPP). These rotations were originally required for the 2027/28 training year but will no longer be mandatory for programmes entering the National Recruitment Scheme in early 2026.

This change follows stakeholder concerns about system readiness, particularly around workforce infrastructure, financial pressures, and delivery capacity due to changes in ICB responsibilities.

A revised implementation date will be confirmed after a review in 2026. In the meantime, NHS England continues to strongly encourage the inclusion of multi-sector rotations, which remain a key part of Initial Education and Training Reform and are proven to improve recruitment and training outcomes.

We currently have stock available in the country for Mounjaro ▼ (tirzepatide). You may experience temporary disruptions at our logistics provider depots due to unusual buying patterns.
