Yellow Card Reporting and Enhancements

Community Pharmacy is increasingly delivering clinical services and as such will encounter greater opportunity for capturing issues relating to medicines (side effects/ADRs, defective, fake), vaccines, medical devices (unsafe, defective, poor quality, fake), blood product or e-cigarettes.

The PGDs for the Pharmacy First Service makes reference to reporting any side effects to the Yellow Card Scheme but it is important for people working in pharmacy (and members of the public) to become more aware of the other issues that can be reported via Yellow Card.

Leeds Home Ward

Leeds Home Ward supports patients to remain at home during an acute illness instead of a hospital admission. During admission to the home ward, patients care is transferred from the GP to a multi-disciplinary team, including consultant geriatricians. Care includes medication reviews and, sometimes daily, medication changes in the patient's home that the GP may not be aware of. This can often cause last-minute changes to compliance aids.
